DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE

What is Service-Learning? S-L represents an experiential and education methodology combining learning and community service in a single project with a civic and academic basis.

What are you going to learn? Students from Southern Europe will design Service-Learning projects related with Fire Management with the support of different stakeholders (companies, forest owner associations, administrators, researchers).

What skills and abilities are you going to develop? The course will contribute to student training, further developing transversal and employability skills, confidence and capability for teamwork in an international and multi-disciplinary setting.



COURSE ORGANIZATION

Students will travel to ATHENS for 7 days for course attendance (which includes fieldwork). The main language will be English.

Teaching staff from universities, research centers, administration, forest organizations and NGOs

PROGRAM

- Living with wildfires: a perspective from Southern Europe
- Why a service-learning project for facing wildfires
- Multidisciplinarity in facing fire (field trip)
- Designing Service-Learning projects
- Let's face the fires with education and training (field trip)
- Employability in facing fire

PEDAGOGICAL APPROACH OF THE TRAINING ACTIVITIES

- Team: higher-education professors forest owners and managers, and researchers from 4 different Southern European countries
- Practical activities, such as evaluation of fire impacts, interviews of local forest owners and practitioners, games.
- Hands-on activities in forest wildfire prone areas
- Presentations, videos, interviews and reports by the students.
- International and multidisciplinary teamwork.

AFTER THE COURSE

The students will implement the S-L projects in their countries

International internships (1 month) are also available to gain further practical experience in facing fire (expenses covered).

RECOGNITION OF THE ACTIVITIES

The ECTS will be 4 (2.5 for the course and 1.5 for the thesis).

Credits can be managed as an Erasmus internship (learning agreement)
